### **Overview of Key Findings**




- 88% of SMEs experienced a fall in revenues of > 10%, compared to 67% of large companies.
- Decline in demand, managing wage costs and supply chain disruptions were the top challenges for both SMEs and large companies.
- 31% of SMEs placed excess manpower on no-pay leave, while 48% of large companies said excess manpower was not an issue.
- On the Resilience Budget, most SMEs (57%) thought that more measures are required, while large companies said it will help save jobs (81%) and is impactful (76%).
- On the Solidarity Budget, SMEs thought that it helps save jobs, while large companies said it helps save jobs, is timely, addresses immediate needs and is impactful.
- 'Enhanced Job Support Scheme' is the top Resilience and Solidarity budget measure that SMEs and large companies find useful.

### Profile of Respondents: 171 responses, 88% of which were SMEs



### There was a good spread of respondents across various industry sectors




#### **Covid-19 Impact on Business Revenues**



### Decline in demand, managing wage costs and supply chain disruptions were the top challenges for both SMEs and large companies




#### **Top Challenges Local Businesses Face**



## 31% of SMEs placed excess manpower on no-pay leave, while 48% of large companies said excess manpower was not an issue






## 'Enhanced Job Support Scheme' is the top Resilience Budget measure most SMEs and large companies find useful




#### **Most Useful Resilience Budget Measures**

On the Resilience Budget, most SMEs (57%) thought that more measures are required, while large companies said it will help save jobs (81%) and is impactful (76%)






## 'Enhanced Job Support Scheme' is the top Solidarity Budget measure SMEs and large companies find useful

### **Overview of Key Findings**




- 94% of SMEs experienced a fall in revenues of > 10%, compared to 88% of large companies.

#### Profile of Respondents: 88 responses, 82% of which were SMEs



### Most companies were from the Manufacturing (22%), Professional






## Most respondents have presence in Malaysia (45%) and China (32%)










## Travel ban is the top challenge overseas business operations face for both SMEs (83%) and large companies (88%)




#### **Top Challenges Overseas Businesses Face**
